## Types of ED Visa








Purpose	Non-degree, short-course, visiting attend seminars, exchange, internships	<u>Degree student at Thai Universities</u> Bachelor's degree level or above	
Re-Entry Permit	NOT Exempted Exempted		
Visa Extension	Depend on the program duration: Usually valid for <u>1 year</u> or <u>year-by-year</u>		
After graduate or complete a course	MUST process visa termination at CHIANGMAI IMMIGRATION	MUST process visa termination at CHIANGMAI IMMIGRATION  or request visa extension for job-seeking status	

## Visa Application: Process









## After receive acceptance from CMU

Students request for visa support documents through CMU-IRD-VISA Online

Receive CMU visa support documents

Documents are valid for only 60 days
from the issue date.

Apply for Non-immigrant "ED" or "ED Plus"

at the Royal Thai Embassy or Consulate-General in your country

#### **Arrive Thailand**

Student will receive a

90-day permit stamp

on your passport upon
arrival at the airport.

Meet your International Staff at your faculty for contact information



#### **Important Reminders:**

- Student must apply for "ED" or "ED Plus" Visa.
- <u>Do not enter</u> Thailand with Tourist Visa (TR) / No Visa / Visa Exemption (ω./ωω.)
- CMU have <u>no policy to support visa change inside Thailand</u>.
- Student are responsible for the visa application process. CMU will support the necessary documents.



## Visa Application: Required Documents & Information










Apply Online and receive e-files (email) or paper document (air mail)

Contact IR / Curriculum Staff at your faculty and give them your passport & contacts



Copy of passport (first & current page)




ID photo (2 inch or passport size) with white or blue background

Current address in your hometown

Royal Thai Embassy/Consulate <u>location</u> you intend to apply your visa application

Provide your contact info:

Email / Phone No. / SNS (WeChat, Line, etc.) to faculty staff





**Faculty's IR (International Relations)** / **Curriculum staff** will be your primary contact in case of emergencies or important matters during your stay in Thailand.



## 90 days Notification Report

Notification of staying in the Kingdom over 90 days. (TM 47)













A foreigner who has received a temporary stay permit and stayed in the Thailand for over 90 days must notify their residence to the Immigration Officer every 90 days.

The notification report is <u>not a visa extension</u>.



#### **Important Reminders:**

- Late 90 days Notification Report must pay a fine of 2,000 baht.
- If a foreigner is <u>arrested in any case</u>, they must pay a fine of <u>5,000 baht</u>.

If a foreigner leaves Thailand anytime during the 90-day period, the <u>day count</u> will <u>restart</u> from upon the arrival date of their re-entry into Thailand.

## 90 days Notification Report

## 3 ways to report your stay:





Visit immigration website

(<a href="https://www.immigration.go.th/">https://www.immigration.go.th/</a>)

choose 90-days icon
and read the instruction carefully



You can do online report 15 days in advance.



If you renew/change passport you cannot do online report

You will need to visit Chiang Mai Immigration for in-person report first



After in-person report, you can make the next 90 days via online report

For those who renew/change passport, you will need to do in-person report first



#### Mail Report

You can attached your related documents and report via registered mail post.



## Visa Extension: Overview









Must be enrolled and certified by a government educational institution





### How to apply:

Students need to **submit a request** for visa extension to Faculty's IR or Curriculum Staff within <u>30-45 days before the expired date</u>









## Visa Overview: Visa Journey Timeline

You will receive a <u>90-day permit stamp</u> upon arrival.


**Thailand** 

You will receive a **maximum 1-year extension** annually. Visa extensions must be renewed every year to avoid expiration. In your **final year** of study, the extension will be granted **up to the** official graduation date as announced by your faculty.

You are required to proceed visa cancellation after graduation.



## Visa Extension: Required Documents







1 copy of passport (first page & all ED visa stamp page(s))

1 photo (2 inch or passport size) with white or blue background

TM.30 (Notification from House-Master, Owner or the Possessor of the Residence where Alien has Stayed)

Receipt of tuition fee

Academic results (Official transcript or certificate of student status or academic progress report)

\*\* Curriculum details (Course name & level, Duration, etc.)

\*\*IR Staff / Curriculum Staff will prepare these documents for you

\*\* CMU letter to Immigration

- TM.7 Form Application for Extension of Temporary Stay in the Kingdom
- STM.2 Form Acknowledgement of Criteria and Conditions for Permit of Temporary Stay in the Kingdom of Thailand
- STM.9 Form Acknowledgement of Penalties for Visa Overstay
- STM.11 Form Consent Form for Fact-Checking and Information Verification of Application for Visa, Change of Visa Type, or Extension of Temporary Stay in the Kingdom

## Visa Extension: Overstay Issue



OVERSTAY for short period must pay a fine of 500 THB per day (maximum 20,000 THB)

Overstaying for <u>more than 90 days</u> is considered a <u>serious offense</u>. It may result in deportation and a ban from re-entering Thailand.



If you are caught overstaying by an Immigration officer, you may be <u>taken to jail</u>, required to <u>pay a fine</u>, and/or ordered to <u>leave the country immediately</u>.



The aliens overstaying in the Kingdom of Thailand for a long period will be banned from re-entering the country as follows;

In case of alien surrendering to the authorities				
Period of overstay	Period of banning from re-entering the country (starting from the departure date)			
more than 90 days	1 year			
more than 1 year	3 years			
more than 3 years	5 years			
more than 5 years	10 years			

In case of alien being arrested and prosecuted			
Period of overstay	Period of banning from re-entering the country (starting from the departure date)		
less than 1 year	5 years		
more than 1 year	10 years		

## Re-entry Permit: Types or Re-entry

### Please contact immigration office to apply for re-entry visa (fees required)

Single Entry (1,000 Baht)

You can leave Thailand and come back only one time without losing your visa



You will need to redo the process again for your <u>next trip</u>


Multiple Entry (3,800 Baht)

You can leave Thailand and come back multiple times without losing your visa



You will need to redo the process again if your <u>visa is expired</u>

## Re-entry Permit: Exemption



<sup>\*\*</sup> If Non-ED visa holder does not leave Thailand during the stay, you may not need to apply for re-entry permit \*\*

# Re-entry Permit: Required Documents for Non-ED Visa



- Passport
- 1 Passport Copy, certified true copy on the following pages;
  - Biodata page
  - Expiry date page
  - Personal information amended page (if any)
  - Latest arrival stamp page
  - Extension stamp page (if any)
- TM.8 Application Form
- 1 photo (4x6 cm) taken within the last 6 months (for TM.8 Form)

- TM.6 Departure Card
- 1 copy of TM.6 Departure Card, certified true copy by the applicant
- Other relevant documents

  (Only if the applicant is not permitted to leave the Kingdom)
- 1 copy of the above documents, certified true copy by the applicant.

## Visa Cancellation / Termination



**Termination Stamp** 

Students <u>must cancel</u> "Non-ED Plus" or "Non-ED" Visa when graduation, withdrawal of student status, leave of absence, pausing your studies, or resignation.

#### Visa Cancellation is accepted within the period of

- twenty-one (21) days prior to the desired date of termination
- the date a student is granted a degree by the University Council (last day of student status)





Visa Cancellation <u>must</u> be done <u>in person</u> at the CHIANGMAI IMMIGRATION Office <u>before</u> departing Thailand.



## Visa Cancellation / Termination : Procedure

Request for letter of visa cancellation at your faculty IR/Curriculum Staff

Submit documents
to CHIANGMAI
IMMIGRATION
before departing
Thailand



Depart
Thailand
before the
cancellation date



- 1. Student MUST confirm graduate status with Registration Office (Reg-CMU)
- 2. Contact or inform IR/Curriculum Staff at your faculty at least 21 days in advance
- 3. The <u>effective date of visa cancellation</u> will be <u>as written in the CMU's cover letter</u>
- 4. According to the regulations set by the Immigration Bureau, International students in Thailand <u>need to cancel their student visas</u> (ED Plus Visa, ED Visa) after graduation, resignation, or termination of their studies.

#### Required Documents

- Cancellation letter from CMU
- Copy of passport
- ( ) Copy of visa page on passport
- Opy of TM.30
- Copy of 90-days report

## Non-ED Plus Visa: Overview

Non-ED Plus Visa is a student visa for those studying at bachelor's level or higher at Thai universities.

Non-ED Plus Visa allows students to depart and re-enter Thailand without a re-entry permit during their studies.

A graduating degree student is one who is in the final stage of their studies, expected to graduate, and actively seeking employment during their final semester.













# Non-ED Plus Visa: Required Documents for Job-Seeking Status

- Passport
- 1 copy of passport including visa stamp page
- Documents as specified by Thai Immigration Bureau
- CMU cover letter for Non-ED Plus extension (Job-Seeking)
- CMU letter of NON-ED Plus Visa Cancellation

  (According to Thai Immigration Bureau regulations, students need to cancel their student visas after graduation)
- 1 copy of the Employment Contract, job offer's document (if applicable)





#### Notes:

- Overstaying is not permitted to apply
- This visa extension is subject to approval by the faculty, university and the Thai Immigration Bureau.
