This agreement refers to the Memorandum of Understanding signed between Chiang Mai University and Kyoto Sangyo University on August 4th 2014, regarding recognition of their common interests in developing bilateral relations and convinced that cooperation between institutes of higher learning contributes to cultural enrichment, scientific progress and the consolidation of friendship between countries.


Faculty of Associated Medical Sciences, Chiang Mai University, and Faculty of Life Sciences, Kyoto Sangyo University, hereby agree to encourage and promote academic collaboration between the parties. The purpose of this agreement is to develop academic and educational collaboration and to promote friendly relations between the two institutions. This agreement provides for student exchanges under the following terms:

1. Undergraduate and/or graduate students from KSU will visit the AMS-CMU. During their exchange, they will conduct laboratory visits and trainings in the Department of Medical Technology. AMS-CMU shall waive the tuition fees for the students from KSU.


2. For the duration of their stay, students from KSU shall have a supervisor appointed by AMS-CMU who will take care of the students in the Faculty and can be contactable by KSU.
3. Undergraduate and/or graduate students from AMS-CMU will visit KSU to conduct laboratory research, they will share their expertise and participate in academic activities at the KSU. KSU shall waive the tuition and laboratory fees and so on for the students from AMS-CMU.
4. Depending on availability, both parties will arrange accommodation for students in the university's residences for the entire period of their stay.
5. All students are required to have health insurance either through the CMU or KSU-sponsored plan.
6. Both parties acknowledge that the visit by Faculty and students from one university to the other shall be subject to the entry and visa regulations of Thailand and Japan, and shall comply with the regulations and policies of Chiang Mai University and Kyoto Sangyo University.
7. This agreement will become effective on the date that representatives of both parties sign, and will be valid for an initial period of five (5) years. The agreement may be extended beyond that period after discussion with representatives of both parties.
8. This agreement may be revised or modified within the period of its validity by mutual consent. It may also be terminated within that period by either party by notifying the other party not less than 90 days notice of its intention to terminate it.
9. This agreement is written in 2 English copies with both copies being equally legally binding.
10. This agreement constitutes the entire understanding between the parties and supersedes all previous understandings made between the parties concerning this agreement.


